- Goal to be carbon neutral, (Net 0) by 2050.
- 160K spent on modelling their LTP
- Councils are Infrastructure owners: water/transport/built environments
- Mott specializes in Infrastructure that is a key driver as 50% of Council's carbon impact is directly connected to Infrastructure.
- The "How" you build it is important: Systems/Materials/Methodology
- Solutions can be shared
- Embodied Carbon has must be modelled and accounted for *
- Carbon Management 101 PAS 2080

Tour of the facilities displayed a very large complex to cover all ages for fitness and recovery, recreational fun and learning swim skills/water safety.


I was struck by the combination of culture, aesthetics and practicality. Nothing was overdone but the renovations were smart and well delivered. The foyer included carved ceiling panels depicting the Maori legend of the Sky father, (Rangi), and Earth Mother, (Papa), being separated by their sons to create earth/sky/water, where before everything was one. This welcoming space was large, inviting and appropriately gave mihi to mana whenua.

Rongowhakaata Iwi Trust Chair Stacey: Vitality = 5 senses, weave into your strategy.), beautiful waiata

Around the Regions:

- Whanganui Andrew Tripe- Sarjeant Gallery opening this year (Te Whare O Rehua).
 Aspire to have a Marine Precinct, Wanganui is the smallest UNESCO city, The Port "Te Puwaha" = The Gateway; Outside of Auckland, Whanganui has 17% of NZ's Heritage Buildings, "You can't build old buildings."
- Ruapehu Weston Kirton-Based on Primary & Ski Industry (latter \$100mil), and Tourism (eco) Blue Duck Lodge/Timber Trail link. They know they need to diversify and work on such projects as "Mountains to Sea" with Whanganui.
- Manawatu Colin McFadon-Earthquake prone buildings-trying to extend time to address; Wastewater collaboration/centralizations; Horizon's maps are inconsistent on Highly productive land with 40% of Manawatu 1, 2 or 3, need to remove 3. Have room for urban growth of 17,000 new homes. River management is flawed and needs change.
- **Horowhenua** Bernie- 17.5% rates increase, (\$10/week extra = better framing); Waitarere Beach Surf Club a new build; Foxton Pool upgrade; Notable trees in town but want them gone = a big social issue.
- HB Councils Combined
- Kirsten (Napier) Working together for the last 6-7 years has built a solid foundation. Tourism/hospo/Port/Food producers; emphasis on building their peoples capabilities.
- Alex (Central HB) -2 speed economy to be avoided. Have a HB Chamber of Commerce and Iwi collaboration; Driver licensing collaboration with on the ground results; Housing delivery partnerships and Social procurement.
- **Sandra** -Population has 23% Maori and a lot of inequities. Using "Matariki" **strategy.**
- **Hinerua** -Soft and Hard relationships just as important as each other.
- **Denise** -Acknowledge CEs plus teams; focus through communities we serve. Food protection hugely important.
- **Craig Little** -Five other representatives spoke on his behalf; Wairoa part of the graphic below.



*Regional Spatial Plan, Future Development Strategy (FDS) – Sandra and Kirsten Cyclone buy out \$50mil – Hastings/\$2mil Napier/\$50mil Government.

• **South Taranaki** Phil Nixon- Business Park: alluminium electric buses, 1000m2 pallet storage; Energy: "Exciting", oil and gas coming back; Green Hydrogen, 4 turbines, 8 solar farms (3 consented) – Phil doesn't think "highly productive land" is the right place. Offshore wind 10,000 jobs – still 10 years away. Taranaki is hoping to stay the "energy capital of NZ".
