Ora, Samuel Yorston #07	recommendations made in the written submission.	<b>Answer:</b> Not currently, but the project is underway. Palmerston North City Council, Tararua District Council, Whanganui District Council, Horizons Regional Council, and others are currently looking at this.
		<b>Cr Raukawa:</b> Will signage be in Māori and Pasifika?
		Answer: Yes
		<b>Cr Duncan:</b> Does Health NZ have the capacity to follow up on any offending that is reported?
		<b>Answer:</b> Yes, Health NZ have smokefree environmental officers.
		<b>Cr Duncan:</b> Health NZ are accumulating information on youth offenders, how long will the information be held for?
		<b>Answer:</b> This information is not personalised and is in fact for businesses and distributors complying.
		<b>HWTM:</b> Vaping shops have a separate business second door into the premise but under the same registered premise. Are these separate businesses?
		<b>Answer:</b> Yes, they are a specialised vape retailer.
		<b>Cr Loudon:</b> Vaping is better for households than smoking, how does that relate to the desire for Council premises to be vapefree?
		<b>Answer:</b> We see vaping as a harm reduction tool for smokers, however, those who have never smoked are now vaping which is the problem.

	<b>Cr Raukawa:</b> Is there enforcement of fines to distributors?
	<b>Answer:</b> Yes, for distributors they can be given a fine on the spot and then possibly taken through the courts.

Mokai Patea Services, Melaine Pera #03	Cr Hiroa declared a conflict of interest with this item. Ms Pera spoke positively of the policy and the work Mokai Patea does in the community toward whanau being autonomous with their wellbeing.	policy, this will support events in the rohe? Answer: Absolutely, all our policies align with smokefree and vapefree across properties.
		<b>Cr Lambert:</b> Do you give people a timeline as to when they need to move to the lollies from the vape?
		<b>Answer:</b> People do move at their own speed but there is encouragement, guidance, and support.
		<b>Cr Loudon:</b> Do you coordinate with the DHB?
		<b>Answer:</b> Our closest interaction is with our local NRT supplier who is based at Taihape Health Limited. We are interested in working with Te Whatu Ora as a provision of information and resource to our community.
Jo Rangooni #13	Spoke of the concern of lobbyist to influence decision making and was supportive of Council leadership with this policy.	<b>Cr Sharland:</b> With the introduction of new legislation and signs, will we see this working?
		<b>Answer:</b> Awareness is always good and vapefree and smokefree is positive. There should be no smoking in sports grounds and cars, there is also a lot of misinformation evidence base decision.
		<b>Cr Duncan:</b> Would you like more education and information?
		<b>Answer:</b> If you don't try and don't put information out then this is more of a problem.
